




September Workshop

Interlock & 3D Boxes

Create an illusion with these easy 3D wall hangings made from equilateral triangles of any size. The samples here use jelly roll strips 2½inches wide, creating a finished piece measuring approximately 20 x 20 inches. You can make either of the projects at the workshop.





Requirements for either of the two wall hangings

- <u>Nine</u> jelly roll strips 2½-inches wide (or similar). You will need to pick 3 contrasting colours. For each of these colours you will need a light medium and dark shade. Each of these can be in one continuous strip cut across the fabric or in two or three pieces.
- 40 cm of background fabric. Choose a fabric which is tone on tone for best results. Batiks work well. Choose a background colour that will contrast with your fabric strips.
- 60 cm. of fabric for backing and binding.
- · Piece of wadding 21 x21 inches
- Neutral thread.
- 60-degree triangle ruler or template. (Available at the workshop) cost \$5.

Westernport Quilters Caring Quilts Programme

and Donations

This is an outline of how we manage donations to members of the community.

- 1. We make and donate Quilts, Bags etc. Our current regular recipients are
 - quilts to residents of Aged Care facilities (local the area where our members live)
 - quilts / covers to **premmie babies** (Frankston Special Care Unit serves whole of Mornington Peninsula)
 - bags to women escaping extreme domestic violence (Impact for Women)
 - quilts to Wheelchair kids (International program run by Rotary Australia, including local branch)
 - knitted prosthetics to women recovering from breast cancer (Knitted Knockers)
 - other quilts donations in the past and/or future might include to Ronald McDonald House, Quilts of Valour and Peter MacCullum Cancer Centre.
- 2. Raise money to donate to institutions which support research into improving outcomes for cancer sufferers (currently Biggest Morning Tea)
- 3. Donate completed quilts to "worthy" local institutions/groups which have the capacity (and often paid staff) to run raffles or give as prizes for their own fund-raising efforts. We've previously donated raffle quilts to CFS, Beyond Blue, and others on request.
 - Peninsula Home Hospice (covers the area where most of our members live)
- 4. Donate cash from our funds to support emergency response to bushfire and flood events. Therse donations are typically suggested by a member in a general meeting, and endorsed by a show of hands.
- 5. Donate quilts in response to emergencies (floods in NSW, fires in western Victoria several years ago. These relied on us finding a local group or quilt shop where we could send our quilts, and who could allocate them appropriately. Typically the organisations who deal with such emergencies, like Red Cross, want cash donations and cannot deal with donations of clothing, toys, household items, etc.
